At New York Restoration Project (NYRP), we believe everyone deserves access to beautiful, high-quality public green space. Since our founding in 1995 by Bette Midler, we have been partnering with underserved communities to take back public space by picking up trash, planting trees, and renovating parks and gardens. As New York's only citywide conservancy, we bring private resources to spaces that lack adequate municipal support, fortifying the City's aging infrastructure and supporting a safer, healthier, and happier city for every New Yorker.

Investing in NYRP is one of the most effective and inexpensive ways to reduce crime, improve health, and forge stronger communities.

In our spaces we deliver critical maintenance that ensures safety and cleanliness year-round, educate thousands of young people annually about environmental science and stewardship, support community-centered public programs, and strengthen social infrastructure neighborhood wide.

Our reach goes far beyond our own parks and gardens. Each year, we help nearly 30 schools, community based groups, senior centers, and public housing associations transform their own spaces through our Gardens for the City program.
